This was our third year serving as the Downtown Charleston distribution center. The mission of Hands of Christ is to bring PC(USA) congregations together to meet the basic needs of children by showing them Christ's love, helping them start the school year with uniforms and basic school supplies. Started in 2002 by Zion-Olivet and Westminster Churches, the organization has now served 52,647 school children in Charleston,

Berkley, Dorchester, Colleton, Williamsburg and Orangeburg Counties and at Thornwell.

This year, one child at a time, 5256 children were served during 11 distributions at seven sites in five counties. Thanks be to God for the hundreds of volunteers, the financial support of congregations and granting agencies, and the gentle spirits of the guests served.

Thanks especially to the many volunteers who helped serve 371 children here during the two distribution days at Second. Christ's helping hands, reaching out to support each other and the children of the Lowcountry at its finest!

HABITAT HOME BUILD

Together with neighborhood churches, worked on a Habitat for Humanity home build for Mitchell Heritage Teshena in the neighborhood. On just one Saturday during the multi-month endeavor representatives from St. James, Westminster, First Scots, Harbor View, Second and James Island Presbyterian churches worked together on the interior dry-wall projects. Six congregations coming together as one and as the community of faith in witness to God... how awesome! Later this fall there will be a gathering to help celebrate the completion of Teshena's home and the presentation of financial support to Sea Island Habitat. Thank you for your support participation in this C-A Presbytery 'neighborhood' outreach mission.



MISSION TEAM

The Second Presbyterian Mission Team continues in its task of sharing God's love locally and globally.

For several days in May and June, Second members joined with James Island Presbyterian, Harbor View, First, Westminster, and other churches in building a new **Habitat for Humanity** home on James Island. As always, we worked alongside the new owner-to-be of the home. Trish Milner was a great organizer for our participation. The special mission offering collected at Second in June was given to Sea Island Habitat as our added donation for the home.

Another of the local programs we support is the work among neighborhood children and young people at the **Shaw Center** on Mary Street. Several Second church members also go there to provide after school "homework help" for about an hour. If you can give an afternoon a week to do this, you will find it not only helpful for the children but very rewarding for you. Contact the Mission Team to find out how to help.

Yet another financially supported local mission is **Water Mission**, formerly Water Mission International, which is involved in numerous projects worldwide to provide safe water sources. Several of our church families are among the thousands who participate every year in their Walk for Water here in Charleston.

The **Seconds Please Tea Room**, which supports the greatest portion of our mission giving, was held May 25-27and June 1-3. The many members

and friends who participated in preparation and serving were not only bringing to the tables delicious food but were spreading the news about why we were doing this. Income from the tearoom this year was \$11,193. Cathy Hinson has continued for years as chair of the tearoom team. The guests and workers were also entertained by Mary Edna Fraser's band, which included percussionist David Hinson.



HANDS OF CHRIST REGISTRATION

Hands of Christ, a presbytery-wide organization which provides school clothing and supplies for pre-school through 8th grade children, once again used our church buildings for two of their distribution days, August 7th and 8th. Several members also volunteered at other church distributions. David Savard, a member of the Hands of Christ board, was instrumental in overseeing the amazing process of receiving the clothing and supplies, then registering the families, then the individual "shopping" by each child accompanied by a volunteer. So many young volunteers showed up the first evening that some of us older members just stood aside and enjoyed watching. There was a special offering for Hands of Christ.

We continue to hear from and pray for our mission co-worker, Leisa Wagstaff, who has been helping the Presbyterian Church of South Sudan strengthen its educational ministry by developing in-service teacher training programs nurturing community participation in education. Our financial and prayer support for her keeps us involved in this young but war-torn country. Prayer cards with more about Leisa are available in the information racks in the church foyer and near the education building door. You can also go to pcusa.org/leisa-wagstaff for more of her background and to read some of her letters.

In August, we had the privilege to learn about God's work in another African country. The Mission Team sponsored a presentation by **Sonia and Steve Dettweiler**, parents of our member Joel, as they shared with us their work with Wycliffe Bible Translators in Nigeria, where there are hundreds of different native languages.

We participate in medical mission work in Haiti and in the Democratic Republic of Congo through our donation to the **Medical Benevolence Foundation**. MBF offered a mission trip to Haiti for this October, and a local person plans to go. We hope to hear about it later.

We participate in the four denomination-wide special offerings of the Presbyterian Church (USA), One Great Hour of Sharing (Palm Sunday), Pentecost (Pentecost Sunday), Peace and Global Witness (World Communion Sunday – October 1st this year), and Christmas Joy (December 24th). Our giving for One Great Hour of Sharing this year was \$1,407.63. For the Pentecost Offering this

year, members gave \$570. This offering serves children and youth, including the Young Adult Volunteers. 25% of this stays with our congregation. This will be seed money for the neighborhood Bible School Liv Cappelmann is planning for next year.

There are also, within the presbyteries of South Carolina, an offering supporting **Thornwell Home for Children**, to be given November 19th, and an offering for **Presbyterian Communities of South Carolina**, to which members gave \$803 this past Mother's Day.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

The Finance Committee consists of Norman Hook, Mia Maness, Dingle Howe, Cassandra Hutchens, Aled Pritchard, Laura Ott, and Debra J. Gammons. Laura Ott is also in charge of Stewardship. Peter Rupert is the outgoing Treasurer. Patterson Smith is a former member of the Finance Committee. Those in charge of budgets have been requested to submit their 2018 proposed Budgets by the end of September. The Finance Committee will review the individual proposed Budgets and submit an overall Budget to the Session for approval.

Second Presbyterian has been blessed with giving from members and friends who have been generous. Five funds are currently being handled by Millennium Private Wealth. These funds are the Roberson Fund, Thiele Fund, Allan Fund, Foundation Account, and Cemetery Fund. As of July 31, 2017, the balances were \$119,334.47 in the Roberson Fund; \$24,597.15 in the Allan Fund; and \$155,079.48 in the Foundation Account. As of September 2017, the balance in the Cemetery Fund was \$57,946.47; \$1500 was deducted September 2017 for tree work done in the cemetery. As of September 11, 2017, the balance in the Thiele Fund was \$494,814.68; \$3,000 was deducted August 11th, \$13,000 was deducted August 24th, and \$12,000 was deducted September 2017. These deductions were necessary to keep the church's operating account from going into the negative.

Yearly expenses for the church total \$558,056.00. The deductible for hurricane insurance is \$500,000.00. Giving from the heart and giving a little more is necessary for the ongoing operation of the church. The Finance Committee is open to ideas with the emphasis on Jesus Christ that will increase income and decrease spending. The Finance Committee welcomes members and friends to include Second Presbyterian in their estate and planned giving. Let your legacy be one of love and hope.



PROPERTY COMMITTEE

The Property Committee, now formally encompassing Grounds as part of some reorganization efforts, continues to be a very active committee serving the purpose of Second Presbyterian Church.

During the course of the year, the common responsibilities include reviewing multiple requests for use of Church facilities and passing along those recommendations to the Session for approval as well as addressing more urgent interior and exterior repair needs in the most efficient and economical manner. The committee communicates heavily via email, with a large distribution list, allowing us to draw on many areas of expertise based on the particular challenge we are attempting to solve.

While we are all thankful for the limited impact of Hurricane Irma, inspection of the Sanctuary discovered water damage via a combination of roof leaks and broken windows. The primary area affected is located in the balcony behind the hand bell choir tables.

The longer-term planning to improve the structural integrity of the Church buildings continues to be the largest of projects, which will require the necessary capital to fully implement.



The committee continues to be appreciative of Sue Henderson sharing observations and proactively solving many of those items. She has communicated with the Parent's Guild to fund refurbishing the 3 children's restrooms in the Kindergarten Building, focused on new faucets, cleaning the existing tiles, and painting walls and stalls.



One of the more pressing challenges our committee would like to solve is scheduling consistent work days during the calendar year, we encourage congregation members to lend a hand to maintain and beautify the wonderful structures and grounds we are blessed to call our Church home.
