FINANCIAL PEACE UNIVERSITY is a program that teaches 7 baby steps to handling money, getting out of debt, and building financial peace. #### SEA ISLANDS WATER WELLNESS MISSION

For most of us, household water is so readily available that we barely think about it. We take for granted our access to potable water and modern sanitation. We simply assume that everyone in our community has access to these basic necessities. Sadly, this is not the case in some homes on Johns and Wadmalaw Island. The lack of potable water and modern sanitation is especially problematic for the elderly, pregnant women, infants, and young children.



**The Need**: In our coastal environment, there are many issues that contribute to a lack of safe and clean water:

- Failing old wells with rusty pipes
- Salt water intrusion.
- High Iron/Sulphur content

These cause health concerns for families and are especially problematic for the elderly, pregnant women, infants, and young children. And some of these families simply cannot afford to get their wells fixed.

**Our Goal**: To provide clean, safe water to those in need by providing for the repair or replacement of affected wells, connecting a source of running water, and or installing a filtration system.

How it Works: A licensed water/well contractor and a member of the Foundation will visit the family, assess the need and provide a plan to the Foundation to improve the water service. The Foundation will pay the contractor directly. No funds will go to the recipient and they will not be asked to pay for any portion of the approved work. The Foundation will assist as many residents as funds allow. There is already a waiting list of families who need help!



## STEERING COMMITTEE

The Session approved the formation of a Steering Committee as a result of a congregational meeting to discuss ways to capitalize on the ideas and resources of Church members. The team, Rebecca Darwin, Dingle Howe, David Savard, will be working with standing committees and the adult Sunday School Class to capture needs among members and to drive opportunities for engagement within the various ministries of the Church. Two areas identified this far have been kicked off: A "wish list" for donations to help reduce expenses and "Brother's Challenge" to give an extra \$10 per week. As the Second Presbyterian Mission Team looks forward through the spring to the summer, we continue to be led by Matthew 25: 35 - 36, "I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and



you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me." Members of the congregation gave generously on April 21st to the **One Great Hour of Sharing** to provide food for the hungry, disaster assistance, and help for people who are developing projects to improve their own lives. They gave again on May 12th to the **Mother's Day Offering**, which supports needy residents of the Presbyterian Communities of South Carolina.

The upcoming **Tea Room**, May 24-26<sup>th</sup>, is significantly important to the mission ministries of Second Presbyterian because its proceeds go toward our mission giving. Please give it your support!

The **Pentecost Offering** will be given on June 9<sup>th</sup>. This offering supports young people of the church by nurturing their faith, ideas, and unique gifts which they then share with the church and the world. 40% of the offering remains with our congregation to use for children and youth programs. Last year those funds were used for Vacation Bible School. 25% is used for the Young Adult Volunteers program. These young volunteers, who raise most of their own support, serve in communities in the U.S. and around the world. 35% goes to youth and child ministries, such as the youth conferences in Montreat.

We are also looking forward to participating in the **Hands of Christ** ministry this summer. This ministry provides school uniforms and some school supplies for children of local families in need. One of the distribution locations is our church, and many hands are needed to help the process run smoothly. Watch for more information on how you can be involved. This will be on August 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> this year. Our congregational offering to support the ministry will be given on June 30<sup>th</sup>. We have budgeted expenses of \$497,368.00 and income of \$433,910.00; that leaves a deficit of \$63,458.00.

The Committee's responsibility mirrors that of the Church; that responsibility includes honesty, clarity, and forthrightness. Second Presbyterian does not belong to us; it is God's Church. The committee, and especially a dedicated few, respond to myriad issues that need to be addressed-anything from sewer issues in the kindergarten to painting windows on the education building, changing ballasts and light bulbs to overseeing the installation of a new AC in the choir loft.

Rob McCready and Chuck Medbery are currently preparing for our new residents, the Charleston Academy of Music, who will be moving in right after Tea Room. Extra consideration is being paid to the Meeting Street side of the Education Building. Updates are underway for additional safety and security as we prepare to welcome the Charleston Academy of Music to the Second Presbyterian family.





## STEEPLE FUND

Last year the Property Committee oversaw extensive studies of the materials that make up our buildings. This is done keep the committee aware of repair needs as well as provide the Session with projected costs for a full future renovation. The studies concluded that the structure is sound and a fund has since been founded to paint the steeple. Excitement was palpable after the Mixed Adults Sunday School class pledged significant contributions on the spot toward the project. Patterson Smith has led the effort to continue officially raising funds for the Steeple Fund. \$67,750 has been committed toward the \$100,000 goal. Construction estimates are being submitted and work is expected to begin soon.

We are entertaining more bids for the painting and refurbishing of the Tower to be confident the work is the best possible, accomplished safely and with the least disruption of our worship.
